



EDUCATION AND FOOD SUPPORT

1

A total of **750 families** were enrolled in the Nutritional Support Program, resulting in measurable improvements in household nutrition and food security. A total of **3,000 Ghanaian family members** benefited from the program.



2

ICT TRAINING CENTER

The program trained **180 participants** in basic digital literacy, significantly enhancing their educational advancement, employability, and readiness for today's digital economy.

ST. MARY COPTIC SCHOOL

3

Across **five operations** in Accra and the rural Volta Region, **240 children** were enrolled, contributing to stronger academic performance and improved learning outcomes. Additionally, more than **140 Ghanaian family members** benefited from the program's extended support.

A total of **450 adults** across Greater Accra, Central, and Eastern Regions participated in literacy and foundational skills programs, indirectly benefiting **over 2,000 household members** and strengthening community resilience.

Bridge Program - Education and Community Empowerment

1

Direct Beneficiaries: 600 individuals/year

Delivered English language and computer skills programs through 5 educational and cultural centers, including a new center in Yogyakarta and an educational library in Surabaya.



Bridge Program - Courses and Scholarships

2

Direct Beneficiaries: 300 individuals/year

Conducted language training, personal development, workforce-readiness courses, after-school academic support, and scholarships from preparatory school through university across 5 centers.



Hidup Baik Program - Mengalahkan Kelaparan (Defeat the Hunger)

3

Direct Beneficiaries: 55 families/year

Provided nutritionally balanced food kits on a monthly basis, supporting malnourished and highly vulnerable families in one of the poorest areas of the capital.



Light for All Orphanage Program - Medan

Direct Beneficiaries: 25 children/year

Focused on comprehensive care, education, facility renovations, and the Taman Baca after-school learning program for orphaned children aged 6-18.

Helping children discover their potential and becoming active members of society.




YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

- Built healthier and more resilient homes


